Unfortunately, we also learned about four more deceased cadets. **Peter Venos (1958)** reported the 2009 death of **George Georgiadis (1959)**. **Phil Howell (1970)** relayed that his brother, **David Howell (1961)**, died in 2001. **William Curnutte (1965)** informed us that his bother, **Donald Curnutte (1965)**

passed away in 2008. One cadet, **Tim Blue (1966)**, emailed and asked to be removed from our list and not be contacted in the future.

The book is a reality, or at least 85% of the way to being a reality. In spite of all our aborted efforts and obstacles we finally have something on paper. The first draft is finished and we are now in the process of doing the final editing and proofing. There are lots of photos and comments from various cadets over the years. It looks like it is going to be something we can all be proud to leave as our legacy.

Now we have reached a decision point. As it stands, we can finance most of the cost of the book without too much trouble, if we publish it entirely in black and white. We do have a selection of nice color photos that could be included in color. The big problem is cost. To publish the book with any color at all is almost double the cost.

The only way we can even consider publishing in color is with the support of patrons. If we can raise enough money to cover the additional cost then we will do the color. So, you might say that the "ball is in your court". We will need to make our final printing decision by the first of March to ensure having the final book in time for reunion. So, now is the time. If you would like to be a patron and have your name included on the "Patrons" page, we need to hear from you soon. So far we have had a couple of patrons step forward, but we have a long way to go.

Should we not get enough to print in color, but receive enough financial support, we will try adding a color dust jacket to the book, with some good color photos. Let us hear from you now.

In these trying times, that is a sign that gets attention more than ever. And we are hoping that it will get yours. Seriously, we do need help. This reunion can not be a “two man” job. Yes, we have done it several times and it does get easier each time but we still need others to assist.

There are so many areas that we can use your assistance. Some people have stepped forward already to volunteer but there are still jobs that need you.

- **Registration** – short shifts, could be combined with hospitality. We need a coordinator, and people to work the shifts.
- **Greeters** - Jim Turner will coordinate this group who will act as our official greeters . Volunteers needed to assist him on Thursday and Friday.
- **Raffle** – selling tickets, conducting, etc. Trudy Bulat has volunteered to be coordinator. This lady with her “Purple Pumpkin” was hard to say “No” to at our last gathering. She has several fund raising activities planned and would gladly accept help.
- **Duck Race** – selling tickets, assisting with the race. David Tooker did such an outstanding job last time that we have recruited him again. This year it will be bigger

and better and remember the prize is \$\$\$\$. He will need assistants to pull it all off.

- **Ghost Tour** – Harry Silvis has prepared our Ghost Tour posters, but he can use help in the set up, etc.
- **Hospitality** - shifts maintaining the room. We do need a coordinator to oversee the operation of this room. And we also need hosts and hostesses to man a shift or two during the weekend. (**NOTE:** any class group that would like to sponsor any hospitality event would be welcome.)
- **Memorial Service** –Thornton Ridinger is coordinating this event. He will need help with the set up, and people to participate in the service, or to give out the programs, etc.
- **Sports** - a coordinator to work with Lillian Hess in organizing the following activities, plus others to coordinate the specific sport.
 - **Tennis** – organize matches, etc.

- **Auction** –Prior to the reunion, we need a Coordinator, and possibly assistants, to gather or solicit items for the auction. The possibilities are endless...single items, perhaps a weekend in someone's timeshare or beach house; items from

businesses, etc. The auction can only be fun and productive if we have good things to auction.

FMSA operates entirely by donations and monies we can raise with various fundraising activities, such as the Raffle, Duck Race and Auction. Without those activities we would have ended our last reunion well in the red.
